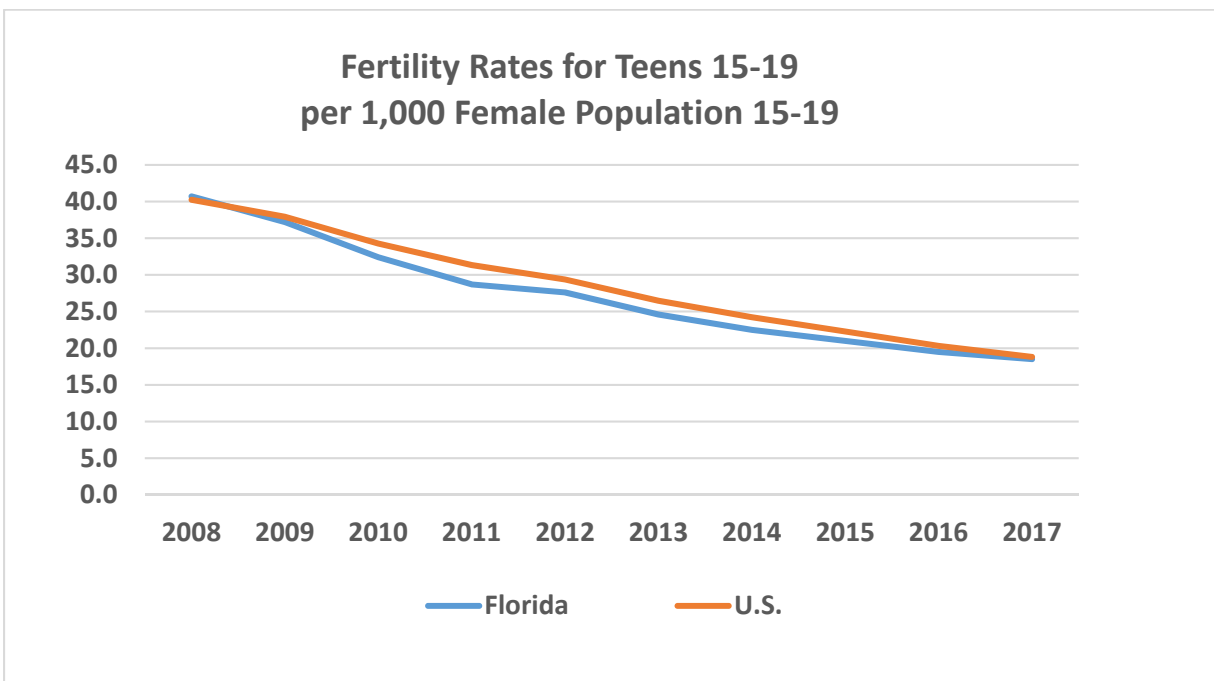




FLHealthCHARTS.com Statistical Brief Teen Birth Rates in Florida Decreased Substantially in the Last 10 Years

From 2008 to 2017 Florida's teen fertility rate decreased steadily and was 54.5% lower in 2017 than in 2008.

- In 2008 there were 24,089 births to mothers age 15 to 19. This computes to a fertility rate of 40.7 births per 1,000 females age 15 to 19.
- In 2017, there were 10,709 births to mothers age 15 to 19. This computes to a fertility rate of 18.5 births per 1,000 females age 15 to 19.
- The U.S. fertility rate for teens age 15 to 19 was 40.2 in 2008 and decreased by 53.2% to 18.8 in 2017.
