DOH-Bay Provides Preventive Dental Services to Incarcerated Juveniles

DOH-Bay's Children's Dentistry Clinic partnered with the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) to provide preventative dental care to incarcerated juveniles at the Bay Regional Juvenile Detention Center. On April 5, using the DOH-Bay Mobile Dental Unit, staff provided preventive care to eight patients. "By bringing our dentistry clinic to these youth we hope to be able to prevent tooth decay and gum disease later in their life," said Sandon S. 


Changing Your Selections

- View


Using the previous example, the diagnosis status is now selected as the "Row," and the counts and percentage of total are the "Values."

Florida Annual Morbidity Statistics Report

The Florida Morbidity Statistics Report is based on reportable disease information received by county and state health department staff from physicians, hospitals, and laboratories throughout the state obtained through passive and active surveillance. It is a resource to medical and public health authorities at county, state, and national levels. This report is significant because it serves as the final and official record of occurrences of reportable disease and diseases of environmental origin in Florida for the corresponding year. Data summarized in the report are used to identify patterns and trends of disease incidence that are used as the scientific basis for development of disease control and prevention strategies and policy.
